NCA invites interested parties to work in partnership to reduce the scale of the threat of child

sexual abuse and exploitation (CSAE). NCA is looking to collaborate with organisations to bolster NCA-CEOP's capabilities against the threat of CSAE.

There are a number of opportunities which will allow you or your organisation to join us in our work and to make a distinct contribution to improving the resilience of children against the threat and reducing the number of those becoming victims.

OUT OF SCOPE

This project does not include any commercially-provided support and will be limited to pro-bono relationships only.

There are a number of benefits to an NCA partnership; some of these include:

- being part of a collaboration which focuses on the protection of children against CSAE;
- sharing your expertise with NCA-CEOP to enhance our abilities against the threat;
- boosting your corporate social responsibility by demonstrating your support for helping children to build their resilience when going online;
- joint publicity, where mutually agreed, could, for example, highlight you or your organisation's engagement to reduce the threat of CSAE.





Partnership Opportunities

Pro-bono Support

There are opportunities to collaborate with the NCA on new and/or existing joint projects, on a pro-bono basis. Your products, services and expertise may provide vital links and support to protect children from the threat of CSAE.

2 Funded Posts / Projects

Partners are invited to provide donations for specific roles or projects. Your support will ensure that key objectives are met to ensure that children are protected from the threat of CSAE.

NCA Specials

The NCA recruits a specialist cadre of part-time volunteers, known as NCA Specials, who bring their niche expertise and skills to assist the organisation with their work in reducing serious and organised crime. Areas of expertise include cyber, financial markets, forensics, languages and academic research.

Posts are subject to a full recruitment and vetting process.

Examples

- NCA-CEOP has received a pro-bono full-time member of staff, embedded within the Command, to provide day-to-day technical support to enhance operational activity. These technical solutions have significantly impacted the efficiency of NCA-CEOP's operational work.
- A number of organisations have provided strategic thought leadership and insights to the development of senior-level projects.

Examples

- Some members of the team who work on the Click CEOP response are funded by a third sector organisation.
- A Families Coordinator post is fully funded by an industry partner.

Examples

- NCA Specials have reviewed CSAE-related research proposals, developed and delivered training for CSAE investigators, and provided ad-hoc advice and support to NCA-CEOP.
- An industry expert provides technical advice and support to NCA-CEOP; this support upskills NCA Officers in their investigative work.
