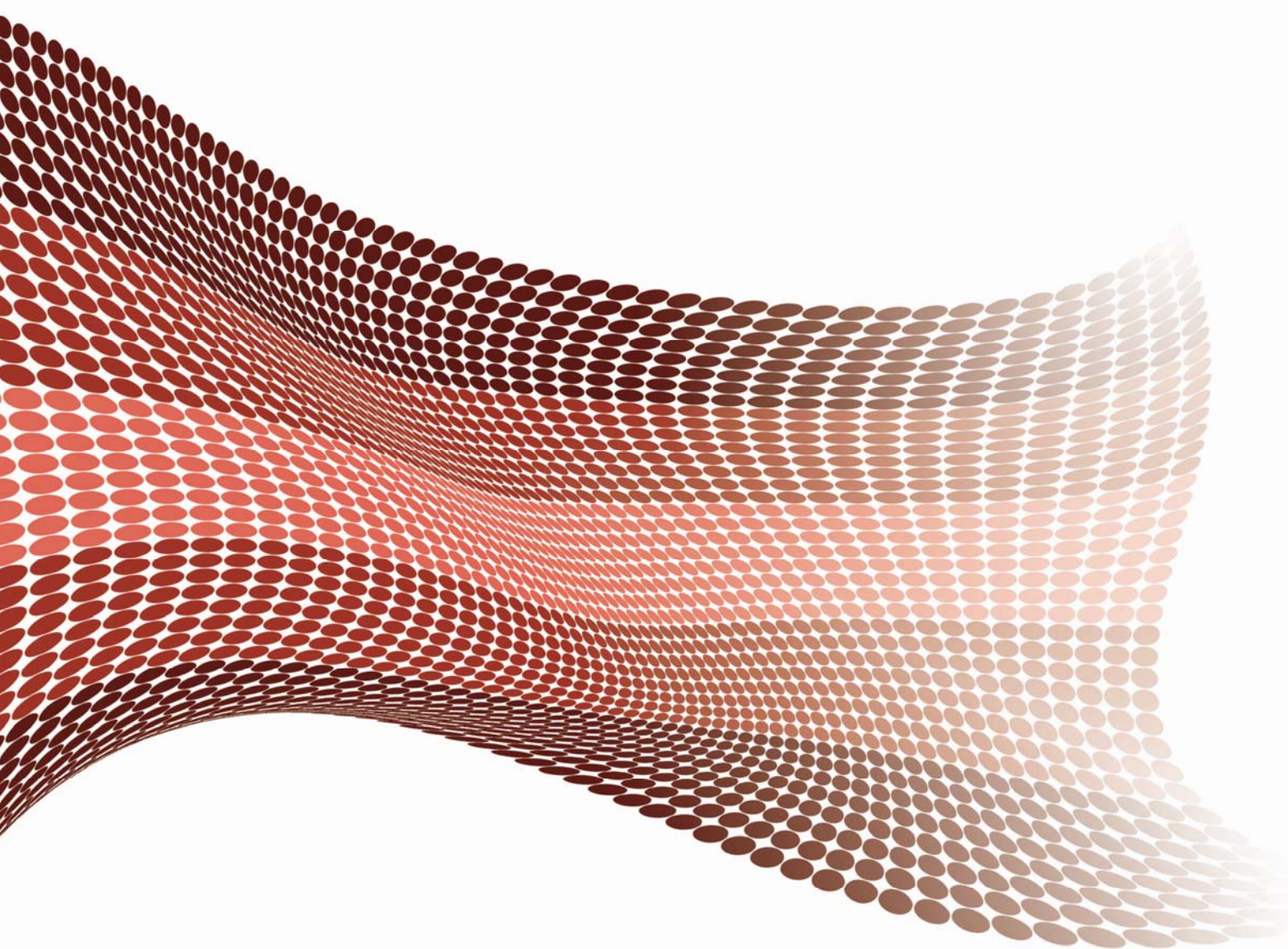

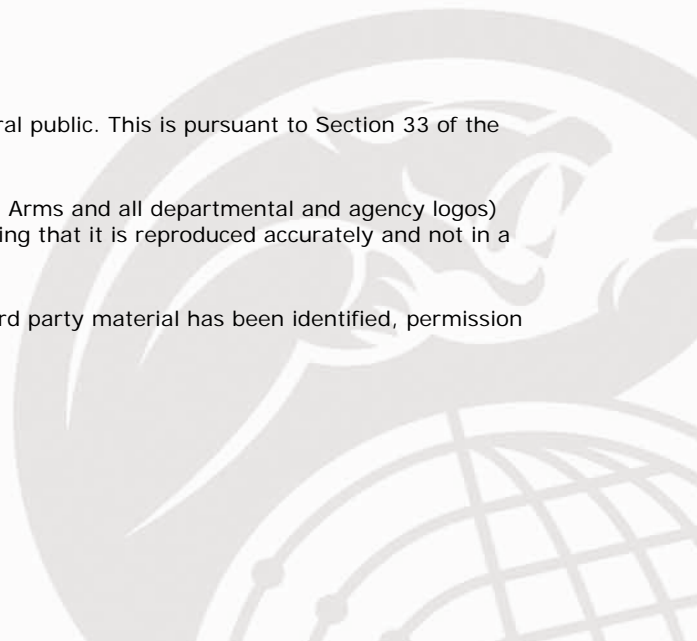

Aim of the Document

This report has been primarily provided to inform the National Referral Mechanism Oversight Board of the UK's delivery against a number of definitive requirements contained in the Council of Europe Convention against Trafficking in Human Beings.

It is important to note that the number of referrals outlined in this report is not a measure of human trafficking in the UK, rather it indicates the number of individuals who have been referred as potential victims of human trafficking.

Report Base

The information in this report is obtained from referrals made to the National Referral Mechanism (NRM) for the three month period from 01/07/2012 to 30/09/2012. The data used is correct as at 02/01/2013. It should be noted that the data used is a 'snapshot in time' and there are decisions on trafficking status yet to be made.

The data cut-off date for this report is 02/01/2013.

Key Points

- During the three month period to September 2012 there were 324 referrals¹ to the NRM, comprising individuals from 55 countries of origin, most commonly Nigeria, Albania, Vietnam, Romania and Slovakia.
- As at 02/01/2013, 97 (30%) of the 324 people referred to the NRM received a positive 'conclusive decision' (CD) and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for people who received a positive conclusive decision were Slovakia, UK, Poland, Romania and Lithuania.
- 39 (12%) of the 324 people referred to the NRM were still awaiting a 'reasonable grounds' (RG) decision. 87 (27%) of the 324 people referred to the NRM were still awaiting a conclusive decision.
- The most common exploitation type for adults who were referred was sexual exploitation. However the most common exploitation types for adults who received a positive conclusive decision, and were therefore found to have been trafficked, was labour exploitation.
- The most common exploitation type for minors who were referred was sexual exploitation. This was also the most common exploitation type for those who received a positive conclusive decision, and were therefore found to have been trafficked.
- Five people were referred from Northern Ireland, 14 from Scotland and five from Wales.

National Referral Mechanism Statistics – July to September 2012

TEXT

1. On 01/04/2009, the UK adopted a National Referral Mechanism (NRM), which is a process to identify individuals who may be potential victims of trafficking (PVoT) and provide them with the protection and support to which they are entitled under the Council of Europe Convention on Action against Trafficking in Human Beings.

2. The process starts when a designated 'first responder'² refers a person believed to be a potential victim of trafficking to one of two separate, but linked, UK Competent Authorities: the UK Border Agency/UK Border Force and UK Human Trafficking Centre. The process has two stages, 'Reasonable Grounds'³ and 'Conclusive Decision'⁴, during which trained staff assess all available information in reaching a decision as to whether or not the individual is a victim of human trafficking.

3. This report contains data derived wholly from information supplied by the NRM. The data only reflects potential victims of trafficking referred into the NRM and cannot be taken as a definitive situation report on human trafficking into, within and out of the UK. Potential victims of trafficking may not be referred into the NRM for a number of reasons and therefore would not feature within this report.

4. Details for referrals from first responders for the UK are contained in tables after each summary of adult and minor referrals in the main text. Details for referrals from first responders in Northern Ireland are contained in Annex D and the five referrals represent two percent of the UK total referrals. Details for referrals from first responders in Scotland are contained in Annex E and the 10 referrals represent four percent of the UK total referrals. Details for referrals from first responders in Wales are contained in Annex F and the three referrals represent one percent of the UK total referrals.

² The NRM Oversight Board has a prescribed list of organisations that may act as first responder and can refer individuals to the NRM. This list currently contains police officers, SOCA, UK Border Agency, UK Border Force, Social Services and a number of non-government organisations (NGOs).

³ The Competent Authorities have a target date of five working days from receipt of referral in which to make a decision. The test that is applied is whether the statement 'I suspect but cannot prove...' would be true and whether a reasonable person would be of the opinion that, having regard to the information available, there were reasonable grounds to believe the individual concerned had been trafficked.

⁴ The Competent Authorities have a target date of 45 calendar days from the Reasonable Grounds decision to make a Conclusive Decision on the individual's victim status having gathered further information. The test that is applied is whether on the balance of probabilities 'It is more likely than not...' that the individual was trafficked based on the information available.

Breakdown of all (Adult and Minor)⁵ Referrals by Country of Origin, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

5. During the three month period 01/07/2012 to 30/09/2012, there were 324 referrals of adults and minors to the NRM. These referrals comprise individuals from 55 countries of origin. The table below shows the 10 most frequently referred countries of origin, which account for 226 (70%) of all referrals⁶.

6. As at 02/01/2013, the most common countries of origin for people referred were from Nigeria, Albania, Vietnam, Romania and Slovakia.

7. The most common countries of origin for people who received a positive reasonable grounds decision, and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process, were Nigeria, Albania, Vietnam, Slovakia and Romania.

8. 97 (30%) of the people referred to the NRM received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for people who received a positive conclusive decision were Slovakia, UK, Poland, Romania and Lithuania.

9. 39 (12%) of the people referred to the NRM had not received a reasonable grounds decision. The most common countries of origin for people who had not received a reasonable grounds decision were Vietnam, Albania, Nigeria, Bangladesh and China.

10. 87 (27%) of the people referred to the NRM had not received a conclusive decision. The most common countries of origin for people who had not received a conclusive decision were Nigeria, Albania, Vietnam, China, Guinea and Uganda.

Breakdown of Adults by Country of Origin, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

11. There were 220 adult referrals, comprising individuals from 48 countries of origin. This table below shows the 10 most referred countries of origin, which account for 157 (71%) of all adult referrals⁷.

12. The most common countries of origin for adults referred were Nigeria, Albania, Romania, Slovakia and Poland.

13. 141 (64%) of the adult referrals received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process. The most common countries of origin were Albania, Nigeria, Romania, Slovakia and Poland.

14. 76 (35%) of the adult referrals received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for adults who obtained a positive conclusive decision were Poland, Slovakia, Romania, Lithuania, Albania and the Philippines.

Breakdown of Adult Referrals by Exploitation Type and Gender, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

15. The most common exploitation types for the 220 adults who were referred were sexual exploitation 108 (49%), labour exploitation 64 (29%) and domestic servitude 34 (15%). Of these, 165 (75%) were females and 55 (25%) were males.

16. The most common exploitation type for adults who received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process was sexual exploitation.

17. The most common exploitation type for adults who received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked was labour exploitation.

Breakdown of Adult Referrals by Age Range, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

18. Of the 220 adults referred, the largest age group represented were 21 - 30 year olds who comprise 111 (50%) of those referred. This age group is also the most prevalent for people who received a positive conclusive decision (30 people, 39%).

Breakdown of Minors by Country of Origin, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

19. 104 minors were referred to the NRM, comprising individuals from 26 countries of origin. The table below shows the 10 most frequently referred countries of origin, which account for 84 (81%) of all child referrals⁹.

20. The most common countries of origin for minors referred were Vietnam, Nigeria, UK, Slovakia and Albania.

21. 69 (66%) of the 104 minor referrals received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process. The most common countries of origin were Vietnam, Nigeria, UK, Slovakia and Romania.

22. 21 (20%) of the 104 minors referred to the NRM received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for minors who obtained a positive conclusive decision were UK, Slovakia, Vietnam, Gambia and Nigeria.

Breakdown of Minor Referrals by Exploitation Type and Gender, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

23. The most common exploitation types for the 104 minors referred to the NRM were sexual exploitation 28 (27%), labour exploitation 26 (25%), and domestic servitude 12 (12%). Of these, 64 (62%) were females and 40 (38%) were males.

24. The most common exploitation types for minors who received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process were sexual and labour exploitation.

25. The most common exploitation type for minors who received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked were sexual exploitation 11 (52%) and labour exploitation 8 (38%) of all those receiving a positive conclusive decision.

Breakdown of Minor Referrals by Exploitation Type and Age Range, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

26. The age range of 16 - 17 years old was the most common for minors at the time of referral and comprised of 34 (33%) of all minors referred. The age range 16 - 17 years old was also the most common for minors granted a positive conclusive decision and comprised of 8 (38%) of all minors at this stage.
